Theme of the Workshop

The focal theme of the workshop “Digital Archiving for Endangered Cultures: Creating Community Archives Using Wikimedia” centers on empowering communities to take control of their cultural heritage through open, participatory digital platforms. As countless languages, traditions, and local knowledge systems face extinction due to globalization, conflict, or marginalization, this workshop emphasizes the urgent need to preserve and disseminate these intangible cultural assets in accessible and collaborative digital formats.

Leveraging Wikimedia platforms—such as Wikipedia, Wikimedia Commons, and Wikidata—the workshop promotes decentralized, community-led documentation strategies that allow local stakeholders, scholars, activists, and volunteers to collaboratively safeguard endangered cultures. Participants are introduced to best practices in ethical archiving, including respecting community consent, accurate attribution, multilingual content creation, and inclusive representation. Through practical, hands-on training, the workshop equips attendees with the technical and editorial skills to upload media, edit entries, and curate culturally sensitive and contextually rich archives that remain open and reusable for future generations.

A central tenet of the workshop is its focus on “knowledge equity”—the principle that all people, regardless of location or status, should have the ability to both contribute to and benefit from the global knowledge commons. It recognizes that traditional academic or institutional archives often exclude or misrepresent indigenous or marginalized narratives. In response, the workshop fosters an ethos of shared stewardship, where knowledge holders are empowered as co-

creators, not just subjects of documentation. In sum, the workshop is a call to action for sustainable, community-driven cultural preservation. It envisions Wikimedia not merely as a digital tool, but as a platform for justice, resilience, and cultural continuity in the face of global cultural homogenization.

About the College

Birpara College is a grant-in-aid, co-educational, undergraduate degree college located in Birpara town in the district of Alipurduar, West Bengal and affiliated to the University of North Bengal (NBU). The college enjoys UGC recognition under 12B and 2(f) since 1993. In 2016, the college was assessed and accredited by NAAC.

About SCTR

The School of Cultural Texts and Records (SCTR) was set up at Jadavpur University, Kolkata in 2003 to consolidate the activities of the university across the broad field of archiving, digitization, bibliography, textual studies, editing and book history. The School has since emerged as the pioneering center of digital humanities and cultural informatics in India, managing a variety of archives, including text, images, music, oral histories, and audio-visual records.

About the Knowledge Equity Fund

The Wikimedia Foundation Knowledge Equity Fund is a US\$4.5 million fund created by the Wikimedia Foundation in 2020 to provide grants to external organizations that support knowledge equity by addressing the racial inequities preventing access and participation in free knowledge across the world. SCTR was the recipient of the grant in 2024.

How to Reach
